

STUDENT WITHDRAWAL FROM SCHOOL

Student withdrawal from school are classified into three categories: Those who transfer to another school system, either public or private, those who are excused from attendance pursuant to SDCL 13-27-1.1 (religious exemption) or 13-27-2 and 13-27-3 (receiving alternative instruction), and those who withdraw from permanent attendance at any school (dropouts). Some withdrawals may create a truancy situation if the withdrawing student is less than 18 years of age.

Withdrawal in order to transfer to another school, public or private, will mean a transfer of school records to the school where the student seeks to enroll. Copies of records so transferred will be provided to the parent, guardian or 18 year old student as provided in FERPA.

Students who are residents of the Montrose School District and who have dropped out of school will be permitted to re-enroll. Students 21 years of age or more may enroll if facilities are available in the sole discretion of the Superintendent. If re-enrollment is at any time other than the beginning of a semester, the student may not receive semester credit for the semester when the student re-enrolled due to the remaining period of time in the semester in which the student re-enrolled.
